Those whom God calls, He freely justifies. He does not justify by pouring righteousness into us, but by forgiving our sins. **He considers and accepts us as righteous not because of what was accomplished in us or by us, but for Jesus Christ's sake alone.** Righteousness is not a part of God's gift of faith, or the result of our act of believing, or the result of any obedience on our part to the good news of Christ. **Rather, righteousness comes by God crediting and acknowledging the obedience and sacrificial death of Jesus Christ for us.** Through faith we receive Christ and rest in His righteousness. We do not generate our faith, rather we receive it as a gift from God. **Faith, which receives and rests on Christ's righteousness, is the only means of justification.** Such faith does not exist by itself, but always is accompanied with all of the consequences of God's saving and loving kindness. **Such faith is not dead, but works through love.**
