People: ¹⁵Let them thank the LORD for His steadfast love, for His wondrous works to the children of men!

Minister: ¹⁶For He shatters the doors of bronze and cuts in two the bars of iron. ¹⁷Some were fools through their sinful ways, and because of their iniquities suffered affliction; ¹⁸they loathed any kind of food, and they drew near to the gates of death.

People: ¹⁹Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and He delivered them from their distress.

Minister: ²⁰He sent out His word and healed them, and delivered them from their destruction.

People: ²¹Let them thank the LORD for His steadfast love, for His wondrous works to the children of men!

Minister: ²²And let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving, and tell of His deeds in songs of joy! ²³Some went down to the sea in ships, doing business on the great waters; ²⁴they saw the deeds of the LORD, His wondrous works in the deep. ²⁵For He commanded and raised the stormy wind, which lifted up the waves of the sea. ²⁶They mounted up to heaven; they went down to the depths; their courage melted away in their evil plight; ²⁷they reeled and staggered like drunken men and were at their wits' end.

People: ²⁸Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and He delivered them from their distress.

Minister: ²⁹He made the storm be still, and the waves of the sea were hushed. ³⁰Then they were glad that the waters were quiet, and He brought them to their desired haven.

People: ³¹Let them thank the LORD for His steadfast love, for His wondrous works to the children of men!

All: ³²Let them extol Him in the congregation of the people, and praise Him in the assembly of the elders.
