Praise

Call to Worship *(everyone together)*

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

“A Mighty Fortress Is Our God” *(sing or say these words together)*

A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing;
Our helper He amid the flood of mortal ills prevailing.
For still our ancient foe doth seek to work us woe;
His craft and pow’r are great; and armed with cruel hate,
On earth is not his equal.

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: *Philippians 2.12-18 (one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What is obedience?
2. How do we know what the Lord wants us to do?
3. How does our obedience show our love for the Lord?
4. How does God help us obey?

Questions for older children

5. Describe a time when you were disobedient to the Lord.
6. Describe a time in the past week when you were obedient to the Lord.

Scripture Memory for October *(memorize these verses of Scripture this month)*

Philippians 4.4-7

⁴ Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. ⁵ Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; ⁶ do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Prayer
