Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Deuteronomy 6.20-25 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What causes children to ask questions?
2. Why would children ask questions about God?
3. What questions do you have about God?
4. Why is it important for parents to know and teach God's Word to their children?
5. Why is it important to remember that God rescues His people?

Questions for older children

1. How does Deuteronomy 6.21 teach us to answer the question of Deuteronomy 6.20?
2. Why is rehearsing the story of redemption so important?
3. Read Deuteronomy 6.24: Why does God command us to do these statutes (laws)? Look at this verse for the answer.

Scripture Memory for February *(memorize these verses of Scripture this month)*

1 Corinthians 2.11-12

For who knows a person's thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God.

Prayer

Prayer *(saying together)*

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.
