*Scripture Reading

I Thessalonians 1.4-6

For we know, brothers loved by God, that He has chosen you, ⁵ because our gospel came to you not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction. You know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶ And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you received the word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy Spirit.



Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: I Thessalonians 1.4-6; Romans 5.1-5 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What are some of the ways the Holy Spirit ministers to us?
2. What does it mean that the Holy Spirit is a *gift*?
3. What does the joy of the Holy Spirit look like? How would you describe this joy?

Questions for older children

1. What is the opposite of the joy of the Holy Spirit?
2. What is the difference between a *drizzle* and a *drench*?
3. How do we receive the joy of the Holy Spirit?
