Genesis 6.9-22

These are the generations of Noah. Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation. Noah walked with God.

¹⁰ *And Noah had three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth.*

¹¹ *Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight, and the earth was filled with violence.*

¹² *And God saw the earth, and behold, it was corrupt, for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth.*

¹³ *And God said to Noah, "I have determined to make an end of all flesh, for the earth is filled with violence through them. Behold, I will destroy them with the earth.*

¹⁴ *Make yourself an ark of gopher wood. Make rooms in the ark, and cover it inside and out with pitch.*

¹⁵ *This is how you are to make it: the length of the ark 300 cubits, its breadth 50 cubits, and its height 30 cubits.*

¹⁶ *Make a roof for the ark, and finish it to a cubit above, and set the door of the ark in its side. Make it with lower, second, and third decks.*



Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Genesis 6.9-22; Hebrews 11.7; Matthew 24.37-39 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. How is Noah described in today’s passages?
2. Why was he considered righteous?
3. Why do you think God gave us the true story of Noah in Hebrews 11?
4. How does Noah’s life encourage our faith?

Questions for older children

1. How graphic is the true story of Noah’s life?
2. Why is this account important for the church today?
3. How does Noah’s life prepare us for Jesus?

Scripture Memory for June: *(memorize these verses of Scripture this month)*

Hebrews 12.1-2
