Story of Scripture: 1 Corinthians 15.19-26

- ²¹ For as by a man came death, by a Man has come also the resurrection of the dead.
- ²² For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.
- ²³ But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at His coming those who belong to Christ.
- ²⁴ Then comes the end, when He delivers the Kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power.
- ²⁵ For He must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet.

²⁶ The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

Hebrews 4.14-5.10

- ¹⁴ Since then we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession.
- ¹⁵ For we do not have a High Priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin.
- ¹⁶ Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.
- ⁵⁻¹For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins.
- ² He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness.
- ³ Because of this he is obligated to offer sacrifice for his own sins just as he does for those of the people.
- ⁴ And no one takes this honor for himself, but only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

- ⁵ So also Christ did not exalt Himself to be made a High Priest, but was appointed by Him who said to Him,
 - "You are my Son, today I have begotten You";
- ⁶ as He says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, after the order of Melchizedek."
- ⁷ In the days of His flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to Him who was able to save Him from death, and He was heard because of His reverence.
- ⁸ Although He was a Son, He learned obedience through what He suffered.
- ⁹ And being made perfect, He became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey Him,
- ¹⁰ being designated by God a High Priest after the order of Melchizedek.





"Just As I Am"

*Scripture Reading: Hebrews 4.14-5.10; Mark 14.32-38

Hebrews 4.14-5.10

- ¹⁴ Since then we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession.
- ¹⁵ For we do not have a High Priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin.
- ¹⁶ Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.
- ⁵⁻¹For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins.
- ² He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness.
- ³ Because of this he is obligated to offer sacrifice for his own sins just as he does for those of the people.
- ⁴ And no one takes this honor for himself, but only when called by God, just as Aaron was.
- ⁵ So also Christ did not exalt Himself to be made a High Priest, but was appointed by Him who said to Him,

"You are my Son, today I have begotten You";

- ⁶ as He says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, after the order of Melchizedek."
- ⁷ In the days of His flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to Him who was able to save Him from death, and He was heard because of His reverence.
- ⁸ Although He was a Son, He learned obedience through what He suffered.
- ⁹ And being made perfect, He became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey Him,
- ¹⁰ being designated by God a High Priest after the order of Melchizedek.

Mark 14.32-38

- And they went to a place called Gethsemane. And He said to His disciples, "Sit here while I pray."
- ³³ And He took with Him Peter and James and John, and began to be greatly distressed and troubled.
- ³⁴ And He said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death. Remain here and watch."
- ³⁵ And going a little farther, He fell on the ground and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from Him.
- ³⁶ And He said, "Abba, Father, all things are possible for You. Remove this cup from Me. Yet not what I will, but what You will."
- ³⁷ And He came and found them sleeping, and He said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not watch one hour?
- ³⁸ Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."




