



Discussion Questions

	e following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this orning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.
1.	Why did Jesus warn His followers to "beware of false prophets"? How is this warning still relevant to us?
2.	What are some examples of false prophets in the Bible? What are some examples of false prophets today?
3.	Jesus tells us that false prophets are like wolves in sheep's clothing. What did Jesus mean by this? Where do false prophets come from? (Read Matthew 7.15 and Acts 20.29-30)
4.	According to Jesus, how can we recognize false prophets? How do we recognize the truth?
5.	What is the fruit of the Gospel? How is this fruit evidence of the truth?
6.	How does Scripture equip us to stand against the lies of false prophets and false gospels? Do you feel adequately equipped by God's Word? Why or why not?
7.	Read Galatians 1:6-11. What are some of the false gospels that we are prone to believe in? How do these false gospels compare to the true Gospel of Jesus Christ?
