The Ascension of Our Lord

Ascension marks the day on which Jesus went to the Mount of Olives with His disciples and ascended to heaven before their eyes (Acts 1.1-12). Though often overlooked, the ascension of Christ is filled with theological significance. Christ's ascension means that in heaven there is One who, knowing first-hand the experience of suffering and temptation, prays for us and perfects our prayers. The ascension is a witness and guarantee of our own bodily resurrection, as well as an invitation for us to set our hearts and minds "on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God" (Colossians 3.1-2) to rule over all things in heaven and throughout the universe (Ephesians 1.10, 20-23). Finally, the ascension of Jesus serves as the prelude to Pentecost, when the power of the risen Christ came upon all believers through the Holy Spirit. -The Worship Sourcebook



He who healed our sorrows here was bruised and broken. He whose love no


end knows, here was forsaken, left all alone. Here despair cries boldly claiming this its victory. Sweeter peace enfolds me:

Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that His hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end.

- ² During supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray Him,
- ³ Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come from God and was going back to God,
- ⁴ rose from supper. He laid aside His outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around His waist.



SERMON NOTES

John 13.1-16 "Washed, Prepared, and Sent"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	What is significant about the setting of John 13 regarding the timing, location, and individuals involved?
2.	Read Exodus 30.17-21. What is the purpose of washing in preparing for the Passover?
3.	Who does Judas represent? What does it mean to betray Jesus the way Judas did?
4.	Who does Peter represent? What does it mean to refuse to be washed the way Peter did?
5.	Read Luke 22.24-30. Who does the group of the disciples as a whole represent? How does Luke's Gospel give us context as to what Jesus was trying to teach the disciples by washing their feet?
6.	Of the three characters in our narrative, which part of their brokenness are you most tempted to fall back into?
7.	How does Jesus washing the disciples' feet give you hope as He is preparing you for your own part of being His disciple?
