


- "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in Me.

- 3. Unpack Jesus' statement in John 14.6. How would you explain this statement to someone who has never heard it?
- 4. What is the significance of all the ways John is using the "In" terminology? What theological significance does this have in a believer's life? What do we call this reality?
- 5. Describe Jesus' relationship to the Father and why this is so full of hope for us who believe:
- 6. What are the "greater works" that the disciples will do? What does Jesus mean by this statement?
