





## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

7. What is the connection between the Holy Spirit's work and Jesus' description of the disciples love for Him seen in their obedience to His commandments?  
(John 14.15; 14.21; 14.23)
8. As those who live in Christ, how can we expect to the Holy Spirit to be at work in our lives?
9. How would you describe the Holy Spirit to someone unfamiliar with who He is?
