

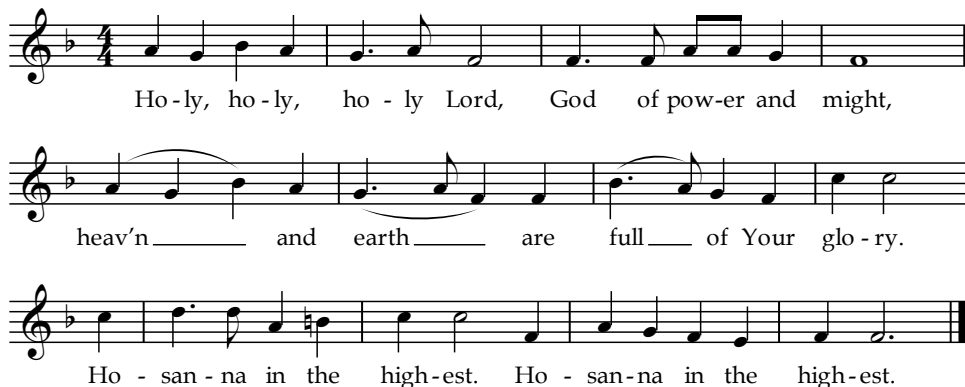

“Grace and Peace”

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

3. Is the grace of God difficult for you to accept? Why or why not?

5. What does the grace of God have to do with His sovereignty? How is the sovereign grace of God the foundation of the Gospel?
6. What kind of peace is Paul referring to in Ephesians 1.2?
7. How can we have peace with God? Why do we need it?
8. How has Christ established peace for the whole world?
